Debra Blacklock-Sloan is a sixth-generation Texan, native Houstonian, self-employed historical researcher and professional genealogist. She also is the historic research





director and docent director for the R.B.H. Yates Museum in the Freedmen's Town National Register Historic District. She is an avid preservationist, responsible for the placement of 32 historical markers.

She has presented several local workshops on African American family research and has been featured in several newspapers and publications, and appeared on Great Day Houston segments where she researched talk show host Debra Duncan's maternal and paternal ancestors. She leads African American Sites bus tours for Touring Texas.

Debra is a member of the Harris County Historical Commission where she chairs the Marker Dedication Committee. Other memberships include the Association of Professional Genealogists, the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society and the Friends of the Gregory Library.

Happy New Year 2023! We were thrilled to see so many of you at our first meeting of the new year on January 5th, 2023! Our guest speaker, Dr. Paul Spellman, talked to us about his research into the 'Old 300'. He tried to find information about all of the people listed in Stephen F. Austin's first 300 settlers to Texas and has published that info in his book, Old 300 Gone to Texas, pictured to the left, below. Did you know settlers came not only from the United States, but also from Canada, Ireland, Scotland and England? Stephen Austin had a few rules about those who could settle in his colony: no ministers, no criminals, and no single men! All three rules were broken by single men coming in pairs forming a partnership! There were also six women who were the heads of their families and four Native Americans! It was a fascinating talk. Dr. Spellman has also written a book of historical fiction called The Murder of William Marsh Rice, the founder of Rice University. His books are available on Amazon.

At our Business meeting, the Chapter approved the naming of Dr. Caroline Crimm as an Honorary Member of our Chapter. We also welcomed three prospective members to our Chapter: Heather Collins, Shana Creech, and Gayla Sonderegger, and we approved the Posthumous application of Corina Cortinas, great-grandmother of our member Vanessa Flores.

TOPIC: There were 59 delegates who signed the Texas Declaration of Independence. Select one of these 59 for your essay and tell how he helped shape the history of Texas. Who was this man? Where was he from? Why did he choose to be a delegate and sign the Texas Declaration of Independence? What contributions did he make to the history of Texas?

#### **Contest Rules**

**Deadline:** Essays must be submitted to the San Jacinto Chapter DRT by February 15, 2023. Please submit via email to sjcdrtpres@gmail.com. Each entry must include a completed 7th grade essay contest submission form.

Formatting: TYPED essays are to be double-spaced on 8½2 X 11" paper, using Times New Roman font, size 12. Top and bottom page margins are to be 1", with side margins being 1.25". The body of the essay can be no less than 2½ pages. No word count requirements. HANDWRITTEN essays are to be on ruled 8½2 X 11" paper. Word count should be between 800 and 825 words. All essays must be submitted in English.

Requirements: A minimum of four (4) references are needed. No more than two (2) may be internet references. References should be listed on a separate page, but not counted as part of the essay length. Included in the bibliography should be the name of the author and title of the book. Newspaper articles should include the name, city, and date of the publication. Facts cited and research references will be checked by the committee. Spelling, punctuation, grammar, and neatness are a consideration in judging. The essay should be original, interesting, and well-organized. The most important aspect of the essay should be historical accuracy.



Formatting: TYPED essays are to be double-spaced on 8½ X 11" paper, using Times New Roman font, size 12. Top and bottom page margins are to be 1", with side margins being 1.25". The body of the essay can be no less than 1½ pages. No word count requirements. HANDWRITTEN essays are to be on ruled 8½ X 11" paper. Word count should be between 500 and 525 words. All essays must be submitted in English.

Requirements: A minimum of four (4) references are needed. No more than two (2) may be internet references. References should be listed on a separate page, but not counted as part of the essay length. Included in the bibliography should be the name of the author and title of the book. Newspaper articles should include the name, city, and date of the publication. Facts cited and research references will be checked by the committee. Spelling, punctuation, grammar, and neatness are a consideration in judging. The essay should be original, interesting, and well-organized. The most important aspect of the essay should be historical accuracy.
