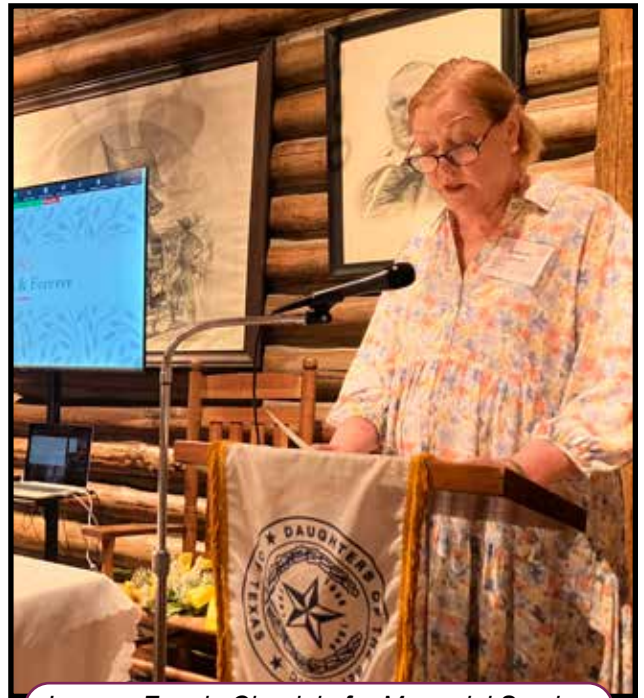

San Jacinto Day – 2024

Four hundred Texans gathered at the San Jacinto Monument on Sunday, April 21, 2024, to mark the 188th anniversary of the Battle of San Jacinto to honor the tradition to celebrate this most significant battle and honor the heroes of San Jacinto. San Jacinto Chapter members were active participants in the celebration.

Nancy Burch delivered the “San Jacinto Battle Report” telling the story of the Texas Army attack on the Mexican Army Camp, traditionally given by a descendant of General Sam Houston. Nancy is the great great granddaughter of General Houston.

The program began with the invocation given by Luanne Zacek, chaplain of the San Jacinto Chapter, followed by the pledges of allegiance to the United States and the Texas flags led by Children of the Republic of Texas members Annie Wallace and Lorien Wolter. Clarissa Grayson and Martha Jorgensen led those gathered in singing the National Anthem and “Texas Our Texas.” CRT members Joslynn and Ji’anna Esquivel participated in the ceremony to unveil the memorial wreath.



Sharolyn Wood chaired the ceremony.

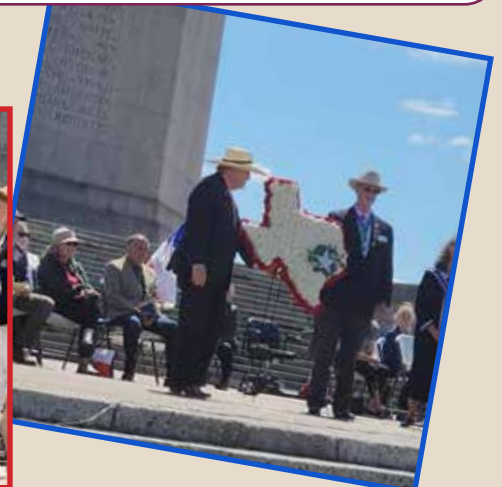

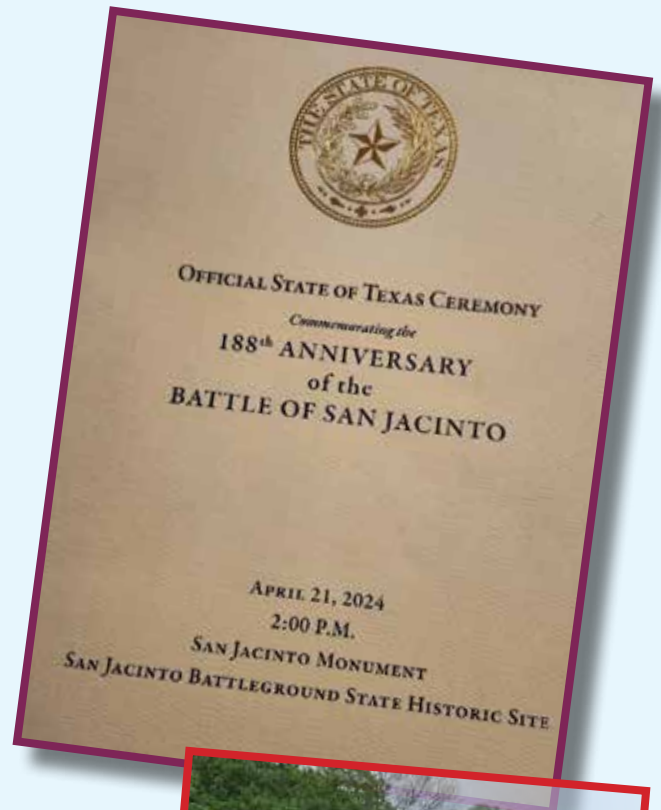

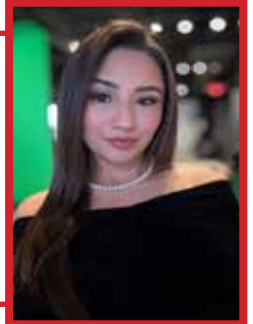
Thelma Maresh Scholarship Reception

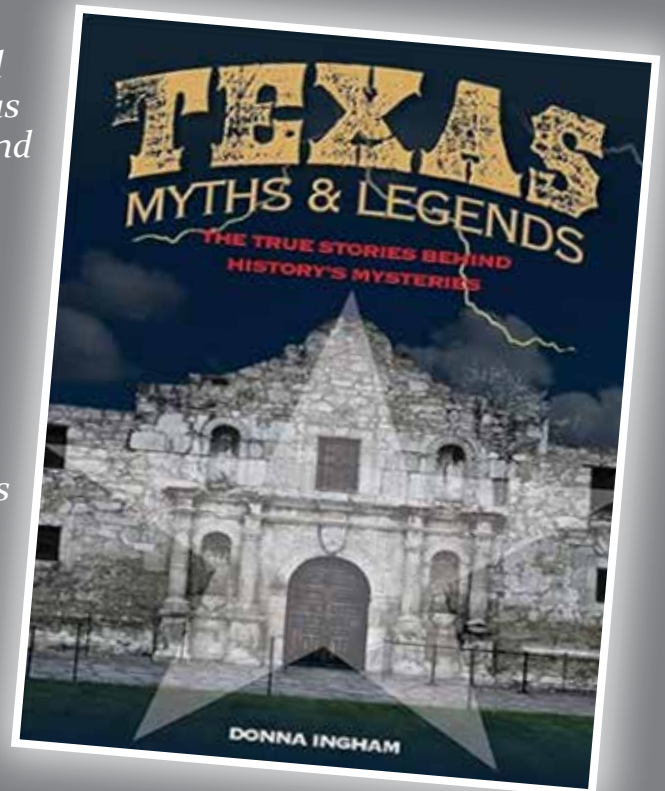


Donna Ingham has written a collection called "TEXAS Myths and Legends, The True Stories Behind History's Mysteries". She relates all versions of various legends of Texas lore from the 1700's to the present and lets us decide whether the stories are factual or fictional! Many of the legends were new to me, but were quite familiar to our Texian ancestors.

Here are some of the questions Ms. Ingham tries to answer: Did Jim Bowie really find the lost silver mines of San Saba, just northwest of San Antonio? Did Bowie and a handful of men fight off hundreds of native Americans at Calf Creek? Was Jean Lafitte's Treasure ever found? Is there such an animal as a Chupacabra? Was Bigfoot ever seen in Texas? Are there ghosts and spirits in San Antonio, especially at the Alamo and its cenotaph, but also at the Menger Hotel across the street and at the Gunter Hotel? What is the legend of Enchanted Rock? What causes the lure of the Marfa lights?

All of the stories are interesting, but one I had never heard of was the legend of Sally Skull. Sally was a real person with a general reputation as a gun-toting, whip-lashing, hard-riding, rough-talking no-nonsense pioneer who might have been responsible for the disappearance of two of her husbands. She had such a famous reputation that frontier mothers sometimes threatened their children with "You'd better be good or Sally Skull will get you"! She was the proverbial boogey woman! Sally Skull even appeared in one episode of Larry McMurtry's TV series 'Lonesome Dove'! The State of Texas erected a historical marker in her honor which is now on the lawn of the Refugio County Courthouse. The story of her life makes for a very interesting read! This book is available in our Country Store!!
